WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Marion, Kentucky, desires to adopt a pay plan and set compensation for classified city employees, non-elected officials, and elected officials for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MARION CITY COUNCIL:

**Section One:** That the pay plan attached hereto as EXHIBIT A shall govern the compensation of all classified city employees, including non-elected officials, full time employees, and employees in categories of employment other than full time, for services rendered on and after July 1, 2019, until amended by ordinance.

**Section Two:** That all part time employees working between 30 and 39 hours per week are entitled to benefits as provided in Chapter 35 of the Marion Code of Ordinances.

**Section Three:** That the pay for elected officials attached hereto as EXHIBIT B shall govern the compensation of city elected officials for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019.

**Section Four:** All ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARION, KENTUCKY, AMENDING CHAPTER 35: PERSONNEL POLICIES TO AMEND THE EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Marion, Kentucky, has authority pursuant to statute to enact Ordinances relating to the City, and

WHEREAS, the City of Marion, Kentucky has codified its Ordinances, and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it necessary to revise, amend, and codify the Employee Handbook going forward,

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MARION CITY COUNCIL:

**Section One:** Chapter 35: PERSONNEL POLICIES of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Marion, Kentucky, Employee Hand Book, Section 7 – Health, Retirement and Other Benefits is amended and revised.

Section Two: City of Marion, Kentucky, Employee Hand Book, Section 7(2):

The City will provide coverage for employees and their dependents up to a maximum amount, as determined by the City and reflected in the annual budget. ANY EMPLOYEE PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2019 SHALL HAVE THE OPTION OF 75% EMPOYEER COVERED COST OF DEPENDENTS. ALL EMPLOYEES HIRED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2019 SHALL HAVE THE OPTION OF 25% EMPLOYEER COVERED COST OF DEPENDENTS. Specific information regarding health insurance plans available to employees should be obtained from the City Treasurer.

Section Three: All ordinances and parts thereof in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

**Section Four:** That this ordinance shall be effective upon its second reading and publication in the City's legal organ.
