Meeting of the Marion City Council Monday, November 16, 2020-5:00 p.m.

The Marion City Council met in Regular Session November 16, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. with Mayor Jared Byford presiding. Council members present were; Darrin Tabor, Phyllis Sykes, Donnie Arflack, Dwight Sherer, D'Anna Browning, and Mike Byford. City employees in attendance were as follows: Adam Ledford, Layten Croft, Pam Enoch, and the City Attorney Bart Frazer. A public sign-in sheet is attached and made part of these minutes.

PUBLIC CONCERNS

Sarah Ford thanked the Mayor and the Council for all they have done for the community. Mrs. Ford was present to ask the public to fill out and return the survey regarding the Bike and Walking Trail. Mrs. Ford briefed the council on the project and answered any questions or concerns the council had.

GENERAL GOVERNMENT

Motion made by Phyllis Sykes, seconded by D'Anna Browning to approve the minutes of October 19, 2020 council meeting same as submitted to the council. All voted yes.

Motion by Darrin Tabor, seconded by Phyllis Sykes to appoint Maryanne Campbell to the Marion Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission. All voted yes.

Administrator Ledford advised the council that the leaf pick-up had started and the city workers were doing it themselves with no help from CCDC.

Administrator Ledford advised that the E911 committee was scheduled for another meeting.

Administrator Ledford updated the council on the delinquent utility water bills. He stated we had been released from the State to start the cut off process. He explained to the council how the process would work and what the delinquent customer needed to do in order not to have their water shut off. Ledford answers any questions and concerns the council had.

OTHER BUSINESS

Council member Phyllis Sykes suggested the City doing something for new business owners.


